# CARE FOR DETAINEES

Support Al Otro Lado, which seeks systemic improvements in the treatment of those legally seeking asylum. Learn more about detention centers through the Freedom for Immigrants website. Write letters to detainees with SOLACE (San Diego First UU) extending kindness and humanity. Detainees are not provided with attorneys, and access to private counsel is extremely limited. Donate to Casa Cornelia, Catholic Charities and Immigrant Justice Project who offer pro bono representation. Give monthly to the ACLU which works for policy change.

#### WORK FOR THE RELEASE OF PRISONERS

Divest from the prison industry. Visit https://investigate.afsc.org/divest for more information. Contribute to RAICES or other bond funds. These loans protect families from predatory lenders and make parole possible. Visit the Interfaith Immigration Coalition website for legislation information. Contact your denominational immigration ministry and support or enhance their efforts.

### PROVIDE HOSPITALITY

Consider short or long term hosting. Immigrants often need a sponsor before they can enter or be paroled. Episcopal Migration Ministries offers tool kits and webinars specifically designed for churches. Asylum-Seekers Sponsorship Project provides coordination and training. Assist other hosts by organizing fundraisers and diaper drives.

Support short term housing with Minority Humanitarian Foundation or Jewish Family Service (jffsd.org) and donate frequent flyer credits to Miles for Migrants. These organizations make sure that new neighbors are welcomed and safely transported to their new home.

# SERVE YOUR COMMUNITY

Research and volunteer with resettlement agencies and other providers who are improving access to community resources. Drive asylum seekers to food banks, free clinics, WIC, legal appointments and court dates. Serve, give, pray.
